#### From the President's desk

While I write this, final preparations are underway for the 28th edition of the Conference of the Parties (COP28) in Dubai. Given that the 2015 target (COP 21) of keeping global warming to below 1.5 degrees has, to all intents and purposes, already been missed, whether or not the

outcome of this meeting will result in an actual reduction in greenhouse gas outputs in time to stave off a two-degree global mean temperature increase is an open question. We are coming to the end of what will doubtless be recorded as the warmest year on record, and the inventory of extreme events - floods, droughts, fires, and more – in 2023 leaves me with the uncomfortable feeling that we may have already passed a climate threshold.

As geographers, we have special responsibilities - to acknowledge the magnitude and importance of anthropogenic climate change, educate our students and the broader community about its nature and causes, and continue to produce the kind of high-quality research that can underpin appropriate policies and strategies toward both mitigation and adaptation. The IGU, with its more than 40 Commissions, and through its Congresses and Conferences, fosters international collaboration in geographical research, teaching, and outreach that helps to meet those responsibilities.

Our next Congress in Dublin 2024 provides us with another opportunity to network, collaborate, and share our best practices to advance the frontier of knowledge of the increasingly strained relationship between humans and the global environment. In the meantime, we can but hope that our political leaders will make wiser and braver

decisions in Dubai than the record suggests they made in the past...

### Carlos Walter Porto-Gonçalves

(1949 - 2023)

was a Brazilian human geographer, an enthusiast of environmentalism, and an author of books on social geography. As a professor, he received various awards in Latin America during his career in the defense of Political and Social Geography, highlighting the one awarded by EGAL in 2019.

Porto-Gonçalves was a fighting partner of the mythical Amazonian defense leader Chico Mendes, who would be signed by his fighter. Furthermore, was president of the Association of Brazilian Geographers from 1998 to 2000. He supported and participated in the so-called "draws", fighting pickets formed by rubber farming families that prevented the destruction of forests by farmers. He also supported the creation of so-called Extractive Reserves (RESEXs).

was a prominent Egyptian geographer who specialized in Rural Geography early in his career.

We remember him fondly for his enthusiastic dedication to Geography. We also celebrate him for his love of poetry and the arts. He was deeply committed to the internationalization of Egyptian and Arab Geography and steadfastly promoted worldwide these schools of Geography, with their particular case studies, themes, and approaches.
